### Courses on Health and Safety in Study and Research Areas

**This course is mandatory to be allowed to start with your internship, together with the blood test and medical examination (for free and to do upon your arrival), in order to obtain the medical certificate to perform an internship activity in our School.**

General course (**e-learning 4 hour – PART 1**) and specific classroom 12 hours (Part 2) are compulsory for all students who for study or research purposes work in laboratories, medical departments and all other work places that present specific risks. According to the Consolidated Safety Act (Legislative Decree 81/08), the status of students in all of these situations, as concerning their safety, is deemed equivalent to that of workers, and like workers, they must be familiar with health and safety requirements in areas designated for work. To take the courses, students must access the <https://formstudelearning.unifi.it/> entering their username (Registration's number - MATRICOLA) and password.

After completing Part 1 and Part 2, there will be an assessment test. If you fail the test, you will have to wait 7 days before you can access the safety course again. The courses can be taken with effect from the date of matriculation.
